- 1. Regular Region VII ROC meetings
- 2. Urge participation in existing State and National professional development conferences or seminars each year as well as Chapter Seminars.
- 3. Promote attendance of chapter officers and committee chairmen at ROC meetings and Leadership Conference.
- 4. Promote attendance of Chapter Delegates at ASSE, National PDC.

PARTICIPATION IN OTHER EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

<u>Objective</u>: To develop and promote educational programs for obtaining the knowledge and skills required to perform the functions of a safety professional.

STRATEGIES

- 1. Promote participation in the educational opportunities offered by:

 - c. OSHA and EPA Institutes and Seminars
 - d. State safety training programs
 - e. Local Safety Council sponsored Safety Educational Activities
- 2. Promote attendance at State level safety conferences.
- 3. Urge Chapters to sponsor and promote attendance at ASP/CSP study groups.
- 4. Disseminate announcements and promote attendance at appropriate training sessions offered by allied societies.
- 5. Urge Chapters to apply for CEU's for any seminar or activity that is of sufficient length and quality to earn CEU's.

MEMBERSHIP

Goal: Develop and maintain programs to enhance membership growth and retention.

MEMBERSHIP GROWTH AND RETENTION

Objective: Qualitative and quantitative chapter growth.

STRATEGIES

2004-2005, 2005-2006, 2006-2007

- 1. Urge Chapters to provide opportunities for networking by:
 - a. Holding regular Chapter meetings as well as combined meetings with allied societies and interest groups.
- 2. Publicize benefits of membership:
 - a. Extend membership invitations to all safety practitioners in the Chapter areas of the Region.
 - b. Encourage membership and participation in appropriate ASSE Divisions (Practice Specialites).
 - c. Publish at least four newsletters annually containing material such as ROC meeting minutes, Regional news, and information for Chapters.
- 3. Encourage ongoing recruitment campaign by all Chapters.
- 4. Encourage participation by interested local students as student members.
- 5. Encourage Chapters to have members upgrade to Professional membership.

STRATEGIES

- 1. Urge Chapters to host or participate in joint meetings with other allied professional societies.
- 2. Promote maintenance of individual cross-membership in other allied professional societies.
- 3. Take news media ads to publicize important events.
- 4. Where appropriate provide speakers on timely topics to schools, civic organizations, clubs and other groups.
- 5. Use the Region VII web site to promote and recognize Regional activities.

PROFESSIONAL RECOGNITION

STRATEGIES

- 1. Urge Chapters to Invite new members to a meeting and publicly welcome and introduce the new member at Chapter meetings. Assign mentor to aid new member transition.
- 2. Chapters present special certificate awards for unique and/or long term Chapter/ASSE service.
- 3. Urge Chapter participation in Safety Professional of the Year Award at the Chapter level.
- 4. Participate in nominating a candidate for the Region VII Safety Professional of the Year and the National Monsanto Safety Professional of the Year Award when appropriate.

GOVERNMENTAL AFFAIRS AND STANDARDS DEVELOPMENT
